Eric Mitnick is the associate dean for academic affairs and a professor of law at the Thomas Jefferson School of Law, where he teaches Torts and Administrative Law. Following law school, Mitnick practiced law as an associate with Willkie Farr & Gallagher, a large law firm in New York City, focusing primarily on complex financial litigation. He has since been the recipient of research fellowships from Princeton University and the Mellon Foundation.

His current research is in the areas of rights, liberalism, multicultural theory and constitutional law, with recent articles appearing in prominent journals including the *UC Davis Law Review, Wake Forest Law Review, Oxford Journal of Legal Studies, Michigan Law Review, University of Pennsylvania Journal of Constitutional Law, Louisiana Law Review* and *Columbia Human Rights Law Review*.
